Mayor Watson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with six members present. Aldermen Kelley and Lewis were absent.

Mayor Watson gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

SPECIAL GUESTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mayor Watson read the Spay and Neuter Awareness Proclamation. Jean Lewis and Amber Mosley accepted the proclamation on behalf of Maumelle Friends of Animals.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – MAY 2nd REGULAR MEETING

Alderman Vaprezsan motioned to approve the May 2nd minutes. Alderman Scott seconded the motion and it passed unanimously by all in attendance.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT REVIEW

Tasha Thompson gave a PowerPoint presentation on the current financials and stated she is currently working on the audit report.

Alderman Mosley asked if the audited financials differ from last ones that were seen. Ms. Thompson stated they did.

Alderman Anderson motioned to approve the current financials. Alderman Saunders seconded the motion and it passed unanimously by all in attendance.

PROCEDURAL MOTION

Alderman Saunders moved to have all ordinances and resolutions read by title only. Alderman Holt seconded the motion and it passed unanimously by all in attendance.

ORDINANCE 901 AMENDING CHAPTER 62, SOLID WASTE

With no objections, Mayor Watson called for the third reading of the ordinance amending Chapter 62, Solid Waste, of the Maumelle City Code. The City Clerk gave the reading.

John Todd, of 145 Orleans Drive, stated he agreed with the ordinance, but would like the Council to look at Section 62-1 which discusses the placement for collection. He stated he didn't want to see yard waste out all week long.

Alderman Holt stated that people work on their yards when they can and that we should allow for that.

Alderman Saunders stated he had a problem with having to put the waste out the day of collection.

Mr. Todd stated that once this wording was taken out there will be nothing that says when yard waste goes out.

Alderman Saunders stated it would be a maximum of 7 days.

Alderman Scott motioned to approve Ordinance 901. Alderman Vaprezsan seconded the motion and it passed unanimously by all in attendance.

ORDINANCE 907 AMENDING CHAPTER 46 OF THE MAUMELLE CITY CODE

With no objections, Mayor Watson called for the second reading of the ordinance amending Chapter 46 of the Maumelle City Code. The City Clerk gave the reading.

ORDINANCE 908 ACCEPTING DEDICATION OF STREETS & DRAINAGE

With no objection, Mayor Watson called for the first reading of the ordinance accepting and confirming the dedication of certain streets and drainage associated with Ridgeview Trails, Phase I. The City Clerk gave the reading.

RESOLUTION INTRODUCTION – RESOLUTION 2016-19 AMENDING THE 2016 STREET FUND BUDGET

Mayor Watson introduced Resolution 2016-19 Amending the 2016 Street Fund Budget to fix the Garden Oaks alleys.

James Wells, of 67 Rolling Oaks Drive, thanked the Council on behalf of the Garden Oaks.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

Mayor Watson noted the state statute regarding naming of public buildings, structures or facilities.

Mayor Watson stated the Memorial Day Ceremony will be at the Veterans Memorial at Lake Willastein on May 30, at 10:00am.

Mayor Watson stated on May 20-21, at Lake Willastein the 2016 River Cities Dragon Boat Festival will take place. He stated they need volunteers and to contact him if interested.

Mayor Watson stated he is available the week of June 27th – July 1st for the 3rd Entrance Workshop. A tentative date of June 27th was set.

Mayor Watson stated there was a 12 inch water main break on Friday afternoon at the entrance of S. Odom and it took about 8 hours to repair.

ALDERMAN'S COMMENTS

Alderman Anderson asked about the traffic signal coordination project Maumelle Blvd. Mayor Watson stated they were waiting on the State Highway Department to review the project.

Alderman Holt stated that with Memorial Day coming up we should all stand up and fight for liberty and justice.

Alderman Scott stated that a resident had a complaint with the noise from the development on Naylor Drive. Mayor Watson noted that our Public Works department starts working at 7a.m. He stated that there will always be grey areas in these situations and we will need to be careful when approaching this subject.

Alderman Scott stated the resident also wanted residents to guard their pets from coyotes.

Alderman Mosley stated he had a resident call and suggest recycling bins with attached lids. Alderman Mosley also asked for clarification on what the City did at the Lutheran Church.

Mayor Watson stated the land adjacent to the Lutheran Church is a green space property that the City mows on a regular basis.

Michael Flakoll, of Peace Lutheran Church, stated that the mowing happened to occur right before the church's 25th anniversary celebration and the church wanted to express their appreciation.

CITY CLERK'S COMMENTS

City Clerk Clausen stated he had Aldermen Holt, Saunders and Mosley scheduled to attend the Arkansas Municipal League Convention June 15th-17th. Alderman Vaprezsan stated he would like to attend as well.

ADJOURNMENT

Alderman Vaprezsan motioned to adjourn the meeting. Alderman Saunders seconded the motion and it passed unanimously by all in attendance.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAUMELLE,
COUNTY OF PULASKI, STATE OF ARKANSAS,

AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

ORDINANCE NO. 907

Amending Chapter 46 of the Maumelle City Code

WHEREAS, Chapter 46, Section 1, of the Maumelle City Code governs smoking in certain nonenclosed, outdoor areas in city parks; and

WHEREAS, in order to further protect the public health, safety, and general welfare of Maumelle residents and visitors, the City Council desires to amend this section of the Maumelle City Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAUMELLE, ARKANSAS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 46, Parks and Recreation; Article I, In General; Section 1, Smoking prohibited in certain nonenclosed, outdoor areas in city parks, of the Maumelle City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 46-1. - Smoking and use of e-cigarettes prohibited in certain nonenclosed, outdoor areas in city parks.

(a) *Prohibited areas.* It is unlawful for any person to smoke tobacco products or use e-cigarettes outdoors, within the Maumelle Diamond Center Baseball Complex, ~~and~~ the Rolling Oaks Soccer Complex, ~~and~~ the Maumelle Aquatics Center, or within 20 feet of a splashpad or stationary playground equipment in any public park within the City of Maumelle.

(b) *Exception.* This section shall not apply to any person smoking or using e-cigarettes in the parking lot of the above named parks or facilities.

(c) *Issuance of citation.* A code enforcement or law enforcement officer may issue a citation to any person in violation of the provisions of this section.

(d) *Penalty.* Any person issued a citation pursuant to this section shall be deemed to be charged with a civil infraction. A fine of ~~\$25.00~~ 50.00 shall be assessed for each violation of this section.

SECTION 2. *(Do not codify).* **Codification.** It is the intention of the City Council of the City of Maumelle that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the City Code of the City of Maumelle, Arkansas, and that the Sections of this ordinance may be renumbered, re-lettered and the word "Ordinance" may be changed to "Section," "Article," or such other word(s) or phrase(s) in order to accomplish such intention.

SECTION 3. *(Do not codify).* **Repealer.** All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

SECTION 4. *(Do not codify).* **Severability.** If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or other portion of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative by a court of competent jurisdiction, such findings shall not affect the validity of the remainder of these sections, nor shall any proceeding invalidating any portion of any section operate to affect any portion of the remainder of said sections not specifically attacked in said proceeding.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAUMELLE,
COUNTY OF PULASKI, STATE OF ARKANSAS,**

AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

ORDINANCE NO. 908

**AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING AND CONFIRMING THE DEDICATION OF
CERTAIN STREETS AND DRAINAGE IN RIDGEVIEW TRAILS, PHASE I, AN
ADDITION TO THE CITY OF MAUMELLE, ARKANSAS, UPON THE
FULFILMENT OF CERTAIN CONTINGENCIES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, ARK. CODE ANN. § 14-301-102 requires the City of Maumelle (“City”) to pass ordinances accepting and confirming specific streets and drainage dedicated to the City; and

WHEREAS, following the approval of the preliminary plat, including all contingencies, Maumelle Planning Staff presents this dedication ordinance accepting all public improvements in the subdivision for ownership and maintenance upon the satisfaction of all construction and installation requirements and the signing of the final plat.

WHEREAS, certain streets and drainage located within the City Limits of Maumelle and identified within the boundaries of **Ridgeview Trails, Phase I**, are planned for construction according to the accepted preliminary plat of the area.

WHEREAS, the City of Maumelle desires to accept and confirm the specified streets and drainage upon the signing of the final plat and upon the presentation of an adequate maintenance bond, and which have been dedicated to the City for public use.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MAUMELLE, ARKANSAS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the authority and requirements of ARK. CODE ANN. § 14-301-102 and upon satisfaction of the contingencies hereinbelow, the City of Maumelle accepts and confirms dedication of the streets, including Ridgeview Lane, Ridgeview Trail, and a portion of Odom Boulevard, and drainage on the Preliminary Plat of Ridgeview Trails, Phase I, An Addition to the City of Maumelle, Arkansas, all as more particularly shown and described on the plat attached hereto as Exhibit A.

SECTION 2. The Maumelle City Council hereby accepts all public improvements in the aforementioned area for ownership and maintenance upon

- a. satisfaction of all construction and installation requirements and the signing of the final plat;
- b. provision of “As-Built” drawings evidencing the proper construction and installation of the improvements; and
- c. presentation of a maintenance bond for all dedicated improvements valid for at least two years from the date of a letter of satisfactory inspection and approval by the public works director or city engineer on the improvements which are being

accepted by the City of Maumelle. The amount of the maintenance bond should be sufficient to cover 50 percent of the total cost of all dedicated or common use public improvements within the development which include, but are not limited to, streets, drainage, curbs, sidewalks, etc.

SECTION 3. Pursuant to said authority and as of the date of the fulfillment of the contingencies above, the City of Maumelle accepts and confirms that the streets and drainage, as indicated above are hereby deemed City property to be under the care and control of the City of Maumelle.

SECTION 4. All provisions of this ordinance of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Maumelle City Code and the same shall be incorporated in the Code.

SECTION 5. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.
